Bio-diversity and bio-abundance

- Achieved to date
- Maintained the Pollinator Garden
- Planted herbs and pollinator-friendly flowers in the Quayside bed and in six troughs placed nearby
- Obtained 50+ free plants from the RHS show

- Future plans
- Prepare, place and plant
 12 more troughs
- Redesign Jubilee
 Gardens and the
 Memorial beds with
 perennial, pollinator friendly, drought resistant plants, using
 RHS recommended lists

Protect and Nurture Wildlife

- Achieved to date
- Obtained funding to support our Bring Back Our Birds campaign
- Conducted a B-BOB scoping exercise
- Presented findings to a public meeting of local residents

- Future plans
- Conduct a baseline study for wildlife and biodiversity
- Install a house martin tower in the Orchard and provide nest boxes/cups
- Develop a hedgehog project, perhaps in local cemeteries

Improve Green Spaces

- Achieved to date
- Transformed the 120m (x2) beds along the station pathway with native hedgerow plants
- Produced a roundabout and verges policy for Arundel Town Council

- Future plans
- Transform the area in front of the station by pruning trees, adding and maintaining plants, as well as installing a picnic table, bench and bug hotel
- Create a mini arboretum on the area outside Warwick Court

Food Waste Composting Scheme

- Achieved to date
- Secured space at Fauna Brewery
- Conducted research
- Developed a survey of residents
- Submitted a "Soil from Scraps" proposal to the South Downs Trust

- Future plans
- Secure additional funding
- Meet with composting champions
- Set up a management committee
- Plan and implement a pilot project

Towards a Pesticide-free Arundel

- Achieved to date
- Met with ADC and WSCC to discuss eradicating harmful chemical pesticide-use
- Initiated research into effective alternatives
- Reached out to Lewes and other pesticide-free towns

- Future plans
- Join the Pesticide Action Network
- Determine who is using harmful chemical pesticides and why
- Plan an information and education campaign on the dangers of pesticide use and the availability of safe, effective alternatives

Engaging People Safely

Achieved to date

- Recruited 30 Green Team volunteers, who devoted 500 volunteer hours (Apr-Aug)
- Engaged 5 local businesses, plus the museum in coffee collection and/or watering
- Organised a Community Day for 19 young people
- Communicated via articles in the Bell and Sussex World
- Attracted 60+ people to B-BOB

• Future plans

- Enter into partnership arrangements with Aldingbourne and Brent Lodge
- Develop a programme for children, youth and the elderly
- Create a GA business supporter incentive package
- Provide coaching for Green Tourism certification
- Secure volunteer time from the Environment Agency and WSCC

Strive for Sustainability

Achieved to date

- Obtained free products and services: perennial plants, soil, seeds and time
- Secured an allotment and free greenhouse
- Embedded ongoing greening activities in the community
- Received over £10k of funding
- Developed a GA strategy and action plan

- Future plans
- Secure tools by donation
- Propagate (cut and split)
- Partner with the Sustainability Centre etc
- Develop a grant campaign
- Develop a community funding initiative
- Set up Working Groups to deliver the action plan
- Develop governance and succession plans

Our Targets

Environment

- Increase the volume of pollinator-friendly plants and trees annually
- Increase the volume of bees, bats, hedgehogs, house martins, swifts, and swallows annually
- Transform green spaces into pollinatorfriendly corridors that are more visually pleasing

- Assess the viability of a food waste composting scheme in 2023 and set-up a pilot project in 2024
- Achieve public buy-in
 by 2025 for moving
 towards a pesticidefree Arundel and a
 significant reduction
 in harmful chemical
 pesticide use by 2027

People

- Attract and retain 30
 active Green Team
 volunteers by 2024
- Support five businesses annually to obtain Green Tourism certification
- Sustainability
- Use the allotment to generate at least 50% of GA needs annually
- Generate at least £3k of new income annually
