- ✓ Wood chip path and circle created and picnic table installed.

9. Hedgehog Event and Club

- ✓ Hedgehog Haven event at Arundel museum in Jan 2024 attracted 50 attendees
- ✓ Hedgehog Club launched by Arundel Agenda 21

10. Sunflower Festival

- ✓ Every pupil at ACE and several classes at St. Philips planted seeds and nurtured plants
- ✓ Sunflowers planted by pupils and Green Team around the boundary of both schools
 ✓ ADC donated 5kg of sunflower seeds to GA. Pots donated by locals. Soil funded by RHS
- ✓ Clay petals and leaves produced by children being made into mosaics
